ANTIQUE TRUCK SHOW SAFETY RULES:

Exhibitor/Vehicle Rules

1. All vehicles shall be equipped with a working fire extinguisher.
2. Parked vehicles shall be secured with a chock block.
3. NO alcoholic beverages allowed on the show grounds during show hours.
4. Fuel tanks must be capped. Fuel leaks are grounds for refusing entry to the show, or removal by towing from the show area. Clean-up fuel or oil spills will be at the owner's expense.
5. Persons operating display/show vehicles must have a valid driver's license.
6. Vehicles shall be operated in a safe and cautious manner and must be in safe working order.
7. Each vehicle will be taken to its designated display area and will **remain in place**, except to participate in an event or to be moved as required or permitted by the show's management.
8. Every vehicle, including trailers, must be covered by owner's Liability Insurance, except non-operational vehicles brought in on and NOT removed from trucks and/or trailers.
9. The show management reserves the right in its sole discretion to **deny admission** to any person or vehicle, or **to require any person or vehicle to leave**, without refunding the admission to registration fees.
10. Be very careful and watchful at all times.

Where the @ Came from...

These days, most people recognize the @ symbol as part of every email address, but it didn't start out that way. - @ apenstaartje- Dutch for "monkey's tail"
- @ snabel- Danish for "elephant's trunk"
- @ kissanhnta- Finnish for "cat's tail"
- @ papaki- Greek for "little duck"
- @ kukac- Hungarian for "worm"
- @ dalphaengi- Korean for "snail"
- @ grisehale- Norwegian for "pig's tail"
- @ sobachka- Russian for "little dog"

Any and All vintage trucks welcome– with limited parking space we have been asked not to bring trailers.

For those participants arriving from the west on Route 30 -- I will be leading a group of trucks departing the Wayne County Fairgrounds, Wooster, OH (on 30) at 8:30am promptly to convoy to the Age of Steam Roundhouse in Sugarcreek.

The Age of Steam Roundhouse tour personnel ask that we are present to start our tour promptly at 10am. They schedule tour groups every 2 hours. So start out early and give yourself some extra time to get there early to turn in your completed liability releases and pay for your tour in the station. Our tour must be finished and we must be leaving by 12:00 noon – they have another tour group at that time. We will convoy through some picturesque scenery to Berlin for lunch at the Berlin Farmstead Restaurant. Upon finishing lunch we will continue touring to the Miller Museum in Shreve. Once you have finished your tour at the Miller Museum you can depart for home going north to Wooster and catching Rt 30. @ 2 miles north of the Miller Museum on 226 there is the Pine Tree Barn on the right that the women (and men) might want to peruse.



PLEASE READ – 2016 SHOW REGULATIONS

Due to possible liability problems, the following changes will be incorporated:

1. No tents or campers allowed on the show field.
2. Chapter tents or canopies must be adequately secured.
3. Show trucks are requested to remain parked on the field until 4:00 PM Friday and Saturday of the show.
4. Show trucks will be allowed on the field on Thursday afternoon, June 16, 2016.
5. Truck Corral trucks must be operational or remain on a trailer during the show.
6. Show trucks must be at least 25 years old (1991 or older) to park on the show field.
7. Any truck that is modified or a show truck less than 25 years old (1992 or newer) must be approved by the Show Committee. A picture must be provided, and you will be notified ONLY if your vehicle is NOT accepted.
8. Improper operation of vehicles on or near show grounds may result in your removal from this event.
